Move Up Arrangements

It is hard to believe that we are in the last month before we break up for the summer holidays. Another school year has flown by and the children have so much that they can be proud of when they think back to what they have achieved since the start of this academic year. We have high expectations in all areas of school life and we believe that children's Personal Development, Behaviour and Wellbeing are at the forefront of everything we do. All staff at Hutton Cranswick C P School aim to provide the children with genuine care, support and guidance on a daily basis and model high expectations and aspirations in all they do. As a school we would love to hear from you, and your thoughts and opinions about the school. It is only in true collaboration and through honesty that we will be able to receive feedback that we can consider and work on to enable the school to move forward. Our children and staff will also be completing a questionnaire so that we get the views of as many stakeholders as possible. The feedback we get will be used to celebrate our strengths and any areas for further development will be incorporated into our next School Improvement Plan for the academic year 2018/19. Curriculum Highlights

We have been embracing and enjoying our STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Maths) sessions on a Friday afternoon. The whole school is involved in this year's STEAM focus - Forces and Construction. The quality and standard of some of the children's STEAM homework is outstanding and we recognise and appreciate the support you are giving your children in this area at home. The children are learning lots of new skills in the sessions, working well as a team and developing problem solving strategies. We have also welcomed a few of our governors to our sessions, making use of their skills and experience has been extremely beneficial to the children.

Linked to the World Cup the children are currently learning about their class teams. Each class has four teams that they are following the progress of in the World Cup and they are learning more about the country and its culture. We will be holding a World Cup day on Thursday 12th July.

Year 2 enjoyed a 1950s themed enrichment day, the children all looked amazing in 1950s clothes and enjoyed a range of activities to develop their learning and understanding further.

Attendance

As you are aware, attendance at school has been something that has tightened each year, with restricted holidays and fines imposed. This year, as in previous years any child who has an attendance record of 90% or below will be classed as a persistent absentee. This means that parents/carers will be invited in to school to put an attendance action plan in place, and if any of the objectives fail to be met then the Educational Welfare Officer could become involved and this leads to a further action plan. We are here to help and prevent anyone from having to go through that process. We monitor attendance in school and send a letter out to any parents/carers of any child who has an attendance record of 93% or less. Please do not worry about this letter, it is only to highlight to your attention and allow you to avoid getting to the 90% mark.

As in any maintained school in the East Riding, the Headteacher will only authorise absence in line with the East Riding Behaviour and Attendance Partnership 'Absence from School for Circumstances Policy'. Headteachers cannot authorise school absence purely for the reason of a family holiday. If your child accrues 10 sessions of unauthorised absence (one days absence equals two sessions) you may be liable for a penalty notice from the Local Council. If your request for authorised absence is declined, and you still take your child out of school a penalty notice could be issued by the Local Council. The school does not receive the money from any fines.

Driffield Show

This year's show will be in term time, on Wednesday 18th July. The East Riding of Yorkshire Council have agreed that attending the show could be deemed an 'exceptional circumstance' due to the nature of the show forming part of our local cultural heritage. This means that children from our school and schools within our cluster will be permitted to attend, with the absence being classed as authorised.

We have discussed this again as a cluster of schools and we want to continue to support the heritage of our local area. There is a letter attached to confirm the arrangements for this year and for you to complete so that we know what your child/children are intending to do on the day.



Food Bank

Thank you to all of the families that supported the Food Drive. As a school we collected 62.40kg which added to the first round of collections from other local primary schools, brings the project total to nearly half a tonne. This is a brilliant result and will make a big difference to the lives of some of the poorest families in the area. Thank you again for your support.

Fortnight Focus

Since the start of the Summer Term we have had a Fortnight Focus for the whole school. The positive ethos of our school enables staff and children to continually challenge themselves, in a supportive environment, and reach their goals. Ensuring a positive climate for learning and development, resulting in children having excellent attitudes to learning and life, is the key to success. Through the School Council we asked the children in all classes to think about what they do well and what they could focus on developing further to be the best they can be. The children came up with ideas such as greeting visitors, walking quietly and calmly through school, opening doors etc. We have been focusing on some of these areas and the children receive 'smiles' on a whole school chart if they are spotted completing the focus. If they reach the target number of 'smiles' they all gain an extra 10 minutes playtime on a Friday afternoon. This is for being fabulous and working as a whole school team.
