Thank you to all of the staff throughout school who have taught the Y6 children and contributed to their progress and achievements. A special thank you to Miss Elliott and Mrs Atkins for their positivity and hard work during the children's final year and in the lead up to the SATs. We are also very grateful to our dedicated volunteers Mrs Bjorndal and Mrs Lilly who have come into school every week to support and help groups or individuals, including SATs Club. We are really lucky to have such an experienced team supporting our children. Thank you to all of our Year 6 parents who have supported their children admirably throughout. We never put undue pressure on any of our children, but they want to do their very best and they do feel the weight of the tests. Preparation to allow children to feel they can access the tests is essential, however we put great focus and importance on broadening our curriculum and ensuring we develop skills through each and every year in all subject areas. In all year groups we offer a range of educational visits, themed days, clubs, play and lunch activities, STEAM activities – and much more. Although Year 2 SATs are much more informal, we would also like to say a big well done to the children for focusing so well on their quiz's and to the Year 2 staff team for making the tests fit smoothly into the daily routine.

Our Year 5 and 6 children thoroughly enjoyed their hands-on, interactive day of learning at the Food and Farming Day at Driffield Showground. Following on from the SATs, Year 6 were all treated to a well-deserved visit to Hull Theatre to watch a performance of David Walliams' Awful Auntie. A great day was had by all!

(Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Maths)

During the summer term your child will be taking part in different STEAM activities on a Friday afternoon. The teachers, led by Mr Nevet as our STEAM lead, have planned exciting and inspiring sessions linked to this year's theme – **Forces and Construction**. The children will be arranged across KS2 in mixed aged groups for their session and will work with different teachers. KS1 are also taking part in the STEAM sessions this year and will run their own version of STEAM sessions on a Friday afternoon. Their learning is also based on Forces and Construction. We had really positive feedback from the children last year who thoroughly enjoyed their STEAM sessions that were based on Survival. Several of our Governors also join us for the STEAM afternoons, thereby increasing the adult pupil ratio, allowing even more of a hands on experience for the children. We benefit greatly from the Governor's skills and knowledge in this area. Look out for further information your child will bring home linked to this exciting learning opportunity.

Governor Spotlight!

Name: Suzanna Hills

Roles: Co-opted governor with responsibility for Safeguarding and Child Protection. I am also part of the Communication Team.



Can you tell us a little bit about yourself?

I have lived in Cranswick for 22 years and love getting involved with the village. I work within Children's Social Care as a Children's Home Manager working with young people who are not able to live with their own families. In my spare time I love going to the gym and walking my dog.

Why did you decide to become a governor?

I decided to become a governor when both my children were at the school (they are both now at Driffield school). I was really keen to become a governor as although I believe academic achievement should be aimed for, I believe that education is so much more than that. I believe that the school should support every child no matter what their areas of interest and strengths are. This could be in art, sports, music or just being a great friend to other children. I also believe that the school experience should be positive for every child.

What kind of things have you had to do in your role as a governor?

Much of my time is spent looking at the area of Safeguarding and Child Protection with my fellow governor Ann Lilly. We meet regularly with the Head to make sure the school is the best it can be in this area. We check that they have all policies and systems in place to help protect all the children. We also come into school and check staff members knowledge. I am also part of the communication team that focusses on reading, writing and speaking and listening. I currently chair the Leadership and Management Committee which I enjoy, as it gives us the chance to work closely as a group of governors. I also attend a variety of training to make sure I am up to date to help support the school.

Car Park/Park

Several parents and staff members have shared their concerns about children playing on the roof of the canopy at the park before and after school. We would kindly ask you to speak to your children about this to avoid the possibility of any accidents. It is great to see so many children playing on the park after school and it really enhances the community feel. We would request however that you could remind your children when you pick them up that they must go to the toilet then, rather than coming back into school later on. Mr Walker starts cleaning toilets straight away and mops the floor so the children are in danger of slipping on wet floors. Thank you.

Thank you to all of the parents/carers who have avoided parking in the car park at the front of school when dropping off at the start of the school day. This has ensured greater safety of the children.

Summer Uniform

Please can we remind you that summer uniform should consist of a yellow or blue-checked dress, grey, black or navy shorts, skirt, pinafore dress or trousers. Skirts should be knee length at a minimum please and no ski pants, joggers or leggings. Children should wear yellow or white polo/cotton shirts. Shoes should always be plain black, not sandals and with no heel. Please remember to check that all of your child's clothing is labelled especially jumpers as we have many left on the field after break times. Thank you.
