In English we will be exploring both non-fiction and fiction texts linked to bears. We will be using these to write our own facts and stories about bears. To do this we will be focusing on hearing sounds within words as well as beginning to think of and write some simple sentences. The children's writing skills will also continue to be supported by our daily phonics sessions.

Phonics

The children will continue to receive daily phonics sessions. During phonics we teach the children to read and write letter sounds, which will then lead onto reading and writing words and sentences.

We always try to link everything to our Learning Challenge so our stories, maths, writing, art and PE will all link to bears whenever possible.



Expressive Arts and Design

This term the children will be given the opportunity to take part in various creative activities, focusing on multi-media. We will also be listening to and creating different sounds, as well as experimenting with movement to music.

Reading Books



To kick off 2019 our first question will be 'What did Anglo-Saxon Britain look like?'

Another year of exciting learning, but again a lot of hard work for the children. If you have any questions or need to discuss anything, please see us:

Computing

Our computing work this term will focus on the use of spreadsheets and databases. We will be finding out how to calculate and convert measures by using formulae in a spreadsheet. The children will begin by searching sample databases before adding to a class database, linked to our enquiry. They will then create their own database on a topic of their choice.

Maths

We will be starting the term with some exciting work on statistics and data. The children will interpret line graphs and explore the use of timetables. This half term will also focus on fractions, as well as their decimal equivalents. After half term, we will move onto percentages. As always, we will be practising and developing our 4 operations skills.

It is important that the children still have a good recall of their times tables and corresponding division facts. They need to be able to complete mental arithmetic questions that can involve different operations and number facts.

Our HCCPS Learning Challenge

Initially we will be finishing off our enquiry into forces by looking at friction. After this we will be moving onto the next key question - **What state is that?** We will be investigating and discovering the properties of materials and the changes that can happen to them. This will give us the opportunity to carry out more exciting experiments!

This term we will be exploring settlements from the Anglo-Saxon times before meeting the Vicious Vikings! Throughout the enquiries the children will be developing their skills in investigation, communication and analysing evidence. We will begin by asking 'What did Anglo-Saxon Britain look like?' before asking 'Why did the Vikings invade?'

We will be finding out about the counties in England and investigating the origins of some place names, both locally and further afield. The children will explore geographical changes over time and will consider the reasoning behind these changes. This will include looking at changes in regions, ways of life, and society. We will explore other enquiries which arise throughout the term. We will kick start our Viking journey with a visit to the Danelaw centre, on **Monday 25**th **February**, where the children will be immersed in Viking life!





Art/DT

Our Art and D&T sessions will link with our HCCPS Learning Challenges this term. We will be developing our drawing skills through observational drawing and drawing from imagination (dragons!), using tonal contrast to enhance our work. Later in the term we will look at some traditional fabric dying techniques.

DT – after our successful parachute investigation last term – the children have requested that we use our knowledge of perfect parachute design to create parachutes to safely land eggs! So leading up to Easter, in DT we will be designing and making parachutes for the Egg-Parachute challenge.

Learning at Home

We ask that your child regularly practises their spellings, reading and times tables. Aim for a short time on each activity at least 3 times per week. Little and often works well for consolidating spellings and improving the recall of multiplication facts. Your child will have a weekly spelling list in their homework book, plus an extra one to have a hand. Most children now know their 'TT Rockstars' login details but they are at the front of the homework book for those who are unsure. Your child has a home reader (of their choice) as well as a reading circles text. We encourage you to continue to read a story at bedtime as it has a huge impact on your child's vocabulary, reading and writing — plus it's great fun and a lovely time to share!

Story Time

We are coming to the end of 'Demon Dentist' by David Walliams and are in the process of choosing our new class read (which the children vote for after hearing some extracts). Ask your child about the book that has been chosen and if they have a copy of that book at home they are welcome to bring it in to read alongside us.

This term we will again be looking at a range of different writing genres. We begin by writing narratives linked to our previous topic of World War 1. As far as possible, we will again link our writing to our different learning challenges throughout the term.

There will be an emphasis on Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling this term. We have already started by identifying different clauses and phrases and classifying these accordingly. New grammatical features and revision of previous learning will take part in these sessions. Spellings will become more of a focus with us looking at different patterns.

PE

PE will take place on a Monday and Friday. Please ensure your child has a named PE kit in school every day as lessons may be rescheduled due to poor weather. Shorts and T-shirts are required for indoor PE and trainers, tracksuit bottoms and jumpers will be needed for outdoor games.

Reading Books

Daily reading continues to be of importance to the Year 6 children, especially reading to an adult at home and spending time discussing the text they have read. Within class guided reading sessions, we will be completing past reading papers becoming more familiar with the types of questions we will be asked and the answers that are required.

Computing

A range of ICT, such as iPads, will be used throughout the curriculum to enhance our learning. In computing lessons, children will begin to look at the processes of programming. We will also have a heavy focus on e-Safety with children learning how to use the internet safely and responsibly.

Maths

Maths this term will be primarily focusing on developing reasoning and problem solving skills in preparation for the statutory assessments in May. There will be a large emphasis on multi-step problem solving where children will be required to apply their mathematical knowledge in a range of different ways. We will also be completing weekly arithmetic tests to maximise their confidence and ensure they are familiar with the layout.

Times tables continue to be extremely important in many aspects of our maths curriculum. While we carry on teaching these skills, please spend as much time as possible helping your child to be as confident as they can in this area.

Religious Education

Following the cycle of learning about religions from across the world, this term the children will continue to learn about both Christianity and Sikhism in their RE lessons. We have so far studied Buddhism, Hinduism, Judaism and Islam.

Safety and PSHCE/SEAL

This term Safer Internet Day is on Tuesday 5th February. The theme this year is 'Together for a better internet'. Through this children will explore how to keep safe on the internet and also take part in different activities which will explore different scenarios they may find themselves part of.

School have recently purchased the HeartSmart approach to teaching SEAL/PSHCE. It is a new method that is said to build character, emotional health and resilience in children. Within this, children will be encouraged to adopt a growth mindset whilst maintaining a healthy emotional core. All of these qualities are essential for Year 6 children when it comes to facing their statutory assessments in May and their transition to secondary education in the summer. We will also continue to explore and promote British Values and life in Modern Britain.

Our HCCPS Learning Challenge

Our first Learning Challenge for the Spring Term is: "Could I be the next inventor?" We will start our Learning Challenge by completing a KWL Grid, which for each child shows (what I Know/what I Want to learn/what I have Learnt). We will return to the KWL Grid at the end of the Learning Challenge and complete the third column (what I have learnt) to show clearly what the children have learnt during the challenge.

As part of our history topic we will research The Great Exhibition which took place during the Victorian times and investigate how these inventions influenced and continue to influence the world. Luckily, as part of this block, we also have a school visit to look forward to.

In the second part of the Spring Term we will immerse ourselves into the Learning Challenge: "Would you prefer to live in St. Lucia or Hutton Cranswick?" Strong links will be made to maths where we can explore coordinate maps and interpret data linked to climates.



Art/DT

Our Art and D&T sessions will link with our HCCPS Learning Challenge this term. We will be developing our art skills using a range of media and techniques. The children will be creating their own landscape paintings in the style of David Hockney once we have explored different landscapes in the village.

In D&T, children will design, make and evaluate their own Fairtrade snack. This will be completed during Fairtrade Fortnight from Monday 25th February.

Homework

A large part of Year 6 is preparing the children ready for their transition to secondary school. As part of this, there will be an increase in homework this year. Children will be given a spellings list to learn, a piece of GPS work or a maths task, along with the expectation of them learning/improving the speed of their recall of all times tables.

Homework will be given out on a Friday and needs to be **returned by the following Wednesday** in order to allow time for us to mark and give feedback on this work. Every child is expected to complete all pieces of work they are set.

Story Time

We will be reading a class story, and other short stories, throughout the year. As a school we are continuing to make a concerted effort to bring story time back! Children hearing stories and being given time to visualise and repeat them is important, and each class will finish the day with story time. Please ask your child what we are reading!
