Sign2Sing

This year we have signed up to take part in Sign2Sing. This is an opportunity for the children to learn sign language to a well-known song whilst helping raise funds for projects that support the deaf community. Sign2sing is designed to promote sign language as a communication tool and make music more accessible to those that cannot hear it. We would like to perform our song to you all on Friday 8th February at 3pm in the playground. We will open the gates at 3pm, you can then watch the children perform and then the children will return to classes to collect their bags etc to leave as normal at the end of the school day. If the weather prevents us from performing outside we will make alternative arrangements on the day. Please join us at 3pm on the 8th of February as we would love to see as many parents/carers as possible. On the day we will also be asking for a £1 donation to fundraise for Sign2Sing and support them with their projects.

Dog Litter

You may already be aware that the village currently has an issue with dog owners not picking up their dog litter. With this in mind, we kindly ask that if you see any dog litter near to school that you make one of our staff team aware. This way we can try to ensure the children do not end up walking in it.

Snow

In extreme cases of snow and/or ice, there may be no option but to close the school if there is a severe health and safety risk. A severe health and safety risk would be presented if insufficient staff could reach the school or indeed the health and safety of staff meant that they should leave early. In the event of severe weather, a decision to close the school for pupils will be made by 7.30am. The Headteacher will contact Radio Humberside and Viking Radio to ask them to broadcast the information. Updates will be posted on Twitter and in the notices/news section of the school APP. Playground areas are gritted if practical before 8:30am and when not, by morning break. All safe routes around the site and across the playground have been identified and will be gritted before giving access to the site. At playtimes a decision as to whether children are allowed outside will be made by the senior teacher on duty in conjunction with a member of the Senior Leadership Team. If the field is covered by thick snow pupils may be allowed to play on the field, make a snowman and throw snowballs. Those not wishing to throw snowballs will be asked to stay on the playground. The school believes that playing in snow is part of a child's life experiences, and as we have had so little in recent years, should be enjoyed! Closing a school at short notice, including closing mid-way through a day, or deciding on a late opening poses considerable difficulties for parents and will only be taken as a very last resort. A complete heating failure in the winter and/or a loss of the water supply would however result in the school having to close. Good communication is essential. Parents/Carers are asked to be responsible and plan more time for their journey, ensure children have suitable footwear for having to walk further and are wrapped up well to keep warm. Parents should not expect to be able to park close to the school at these times. Parents and visitors are expected to use the gritted paths rather than walk across the snow and ice. We thank you in advance for your cooperation, should we be faced with any severe weather this year.
