Summer Term

Welcome back! We hope you have all had an enjoyable Easter break. After a very busy and successful spring term we have started the summer term in much the same way. The children have returned to school and settled well with fantastic attitudes to learning and each other. All of our classes have had a busy first week back and hit the ground running with new learning and experiences. In the hope that the warmer weather continues, it is important that children are fully prepared for being outdoors during the summer months. Please provide children with a named water bottle, a named hat and ensure suntan lotion is applied before school. Can you also make sure that your children's clothing, particularly coats, jumpers and cardigans, have their name clearly marked on the inside. Thank you.

SATs

Year 2 and Year 6 pupils will be taking their end of key stage SATs in May. Year 2 children are tested in reading, writing and maths. Year 2 assessments do not follow a set timetable, therefore Mrs Hoyle will ensure the tests fit smoothly into the daily routine. Year 6 is much more official, and involves testing in reading, GPS, writing and maths. The tests commence on Monday 13th May and will take place daily. It is imperative that <u>all</u> Year 6 children are in attendance that week, so if you have any appointments please try and rearrange them accordingly.

SATs only tell us one factor of a child's ability on that one day of the year. They do not tell us some of the amazing things your children excel at in other areas of the curriculum. However they are a legal requirement and we know that each and every one of our Year 6 children are well prepared to undertake the tests. Their positive attitude continues to be amazing and we are all proud of how hard they are working.

Parent View Survey Feedback

Thank you to all of the parents/carers who took the time to complete our parent questionnaire, handed out at the Parents Evenings in March. We had a great response rate of 51 returns, which has helped to inform us of what we continue to do well and highlight areas which we can develop further. It is great to read positive feedback about the school and we are delighted that it continues to be recognised, that as a school, we place great importance on the 'whole child' and opportunities for all.
