After half term we will be learning about how animals grow by comparing baby and adult farm animals which will be supported by a trip to Honeysuckle Farm.



#### **Expressive Arts and Design**

### **Reading Books**

#### **Computing**

The children will continue to use ICT to support and enhance their learning throughout the curriculum.

We will be learning how to use Concept Maps using the 2Connect program on Purple Mash. We will use these to present our ideas, linked to our main enquiry. The children will also learn how to do some 3D Modelling as part of their Maths work on shape.

#### **Maths**

We will be focusing on shapes, space and measures this term – ensuring that we practise and apply the key skills we've learnt so far within this unit. We will begin with angles and shape. We will also be exploring converting units of measure and using this knowledge in problem solving scenarios. We will also compare metric and imperial units of measure.

It is important that the children still have rapid recall of their times tables and corresponding division facts. We expect the children to recall the facts for all the times tables (up to 12 x 12). Please encourage your child to use ttrockstars, we find 'little and often' works best to help retain these facts.

#### PE

Fiona Tuplin will be teaching tennis on a **Wednesday** and Mrs Webb will be doing a follow up lesson of tennis on a **Thursday** afternoon. Later in the term, we will move on to athletics and rounders.

Please ensure that your child has their PE kit - it is imperative that your children enjoy these opportunities and take part in regular exercise.

#### **Safety and PSHCE/SEAL**

In PSHE, we have been using the Heartsmart scheme, which has been well received by the children. This term we will be looking at how organisations have to make decisions regarding budgets and how those decisions have an impact on others. We will also be thinking about the Internet and completing a unit called "Too much selfie isn't healthy!"

#### **HCCPS Learning Challenge**

Humans: Helping or harming our planet? This is the focus of this term's challenge and is one which many pupils have shown a great interest in over the year.

This topic will predominatly focus on Science, Geography, Design Technology and art, although we will be visiting many areas of the curriculum. We will look at the environment from different perspectives, including artists, scientists and even some politicians! During the first half term, we will investigate renewable energy and look at the impact humans have on the natural world. We will be investigating the impact that humans have had on the world and what we can do to try to help put things right. We will also be looking at the life cycles of various plants and animals and comparing them.

Later in the term, we will start to explore the different climate zones around the world and how some of these areas are dramatically changing. As a Fairtrade school, we will draw on our earlier knowledge about the food supply and investigate food shortages in different areasaround the world, including South America. The children will be encouraged to use and refine their atlas and map skills, as well as developing their knowledge of countries around the world.

#### **Art/ Music**

This term our art work will link closely with our topic as we explore our world. We will explore some famous artists from around the world, who were/ are influenced by nature, including O'Keefe, Van Gogh and Hokusai. In Music, we are hard at work on learning 'Try Everything' by Shakira. The children are currently planning a music 'video' to accompany their rendition of the song.

#### **Homework**

We believe that it is important for children to have a balanced homework diet and also have time to participate in extra-curricular activities — and of course be a child and have fun! We try to keep homework to a minimum so that it is manageable. This is why we set the homework around the key skills. Homework books are collected on a Monday and given back on a Tuesday. Your child should complete the following homework activities for a short time a few times a week: **Reading (their choice/ reading circles text), tt rockstars, spelling practise.** 

#### **Story Time**

As a school, we continue to promote a love of reading and the daily story time is a great way to come together and share a story. We have had a range of people reading the daily story, from visitors, governors and the children themselves. Currently we are continuing with the 'Wonder' novel, which we started last term. We know that some children have now watched the film and they are making comparisons between the two.

Prior to SATS, we will mainly focus our learning on Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling within English sessions. Guided Reading and time to practise past reading papers will also be planned into each day. Now that we are more familiar with the types of questions we will be asked and the answers that are required, our main focus is to work on timing - making sure we manage to complete the whole paper in the given time.

Daily reading at home continues to be of importance to the Year 6 children, especially reading to an adult at home and spending time discussing the text they have read.

From the middle of May our writing will focus on our heavily science based learning challenges: Evolution and Inheritance, Electricity and Humans including animals. We will complete many cross-curricular pieces of writing and



even perform poetry by the end of the year.

#### **Reading Books**

It is important that your child has reading material of their choice with them in school on a daily basis. This could be a book or even a magazine or newspaper article. Our main aim still focuses on instilling a lifelong love of reading.

#### **Maths**

Our maths is improving every single day! I have seen <a href="https://www.numer.com/huge">huge</a> progress in this subject this year, particularly with arithmetic which is super to see. Now that the children are confident with all arithmetic methods, we will continue to apply this knowledge to our more complex reasoning questions.

It is imperative that children continue to practise their times tables. They are extremely important in many aspects of our maths curriculum and the more confident they are, the easier and quicker it is for them to solve more challenging questions. While we carry on teaching these skills, please spend as much time as possible helping your child to be as confident as they can in this area.

#### PE

Our PE sessions will take place on Wednesday and Thursday afternoons. Please ensure your child has a named PE kit in school every day as lessons may be rescheduled. Shorts and T-shirts are required for indoor PE and trainers, tracksuit bottoms and jumpers may still be needed for outdoor games until the weather improves. As the summer months approach, we ask that children are prepared for the sun. Please ensure your child has sun cream protection and a hat for our outdoor sessions. Water bottles are equally important.

#### **Computing**

A range of ICT, such as iPads, will be used throughout the curriculum to enhance our learning. In computing lessons, children will be coding and making computer games using Scratch. We will also continue with our heavy focus on E-Safety with children learning how to use the internet safely and responsibly.

#### **PSHCE/SEAL**

We will continue teaching from our recently purchased HeartSmart scheme for SEAL/PSHCE this term. It is evident that it is helping to build character, emotional health and resilience in children. Within this, children will be repeatedly encouraged to adopt a growth mind-set whilst maintaining a healthy emotional epicentre. All of these qualities are essential for Year 6 children when it comes to facing their statutory assessments in a couple of weeks and their transition to secondary education later in the term. We will also continue to explore and promote British Values and life in Modern Britain.
