### After School Club – CRANTASTIC KIDS

As a result of the outcomes from the Parish Council Rewrite Plan Survey and our school parent/carer questionnaires completed in the Spring term, it was evident that there was a high demand for after school child care provision. In response to this and after liaising with school, Mary Smith has set up a new club in the village called Crantastic Kids, which as a school we fully support. Unfortunately the club has received very little interest and has had to be postponed due to lack of numbers.

After discussion with several parents the reason for the lack of interest could be due to people being tied into contracts with other childcare providers for the rest of this term. For the club to run Mary needs to know that there will be a take up, even if this is for a September start, in order for the club to go ahead. If you are interested in your child starting in September please contact Mary.

Mary and the staff leading the club have undertaken all relevant training and the ratio of adults to children is in line with recommendations. Mary is offering an hourly rate of £4 for after school to 4.30pm and £8 if your child is staying until 5.30pm. The children will be collected from school at 3.20pm and walked to the WI Hall by Mary and her team. The club will also pick up from school clubs at 4.20pm and charge the hourly rate of £4 for the time then spent at Crantastic Kids - 4.30-5.30pm. There will be a drink and snack provided and the children will be taking part in creative sessions such as making things, engaging in group games and drama. The sessions will promote confidence and imagination.

We strongly advise you to contact Mary if you require the use of the club in September so that plans can be made for it to go ahead. The club will need the support of parents/carers in order for it to be a success. This is a fantastic opportunity for the village, as we have very limited options in terms of after school child care provision in the village and it is unlikely there will be alternative options in the future.
