Homework

Currently Fountain Farm have spaces available for after school provision. Many of our children attend Fountain Farm and are all collected from the Reception classroom at 3.20pm.

We are delighted to share with you that we were awarded Gold in the Sports Games Mark for another year. Well done to all of the children who have participated in our sports this year.

Miss Elliott and our JTAs (Junior Travel Ambassadors) have also achieved Gold in the Modeshift award for a second time. Working with Christian Jordan (Road Safety Officer) to organise many events last year and promote safe travel to school has resulted in this fantastic achievement. Well done to the children and all involved. Our final award to share with you is the Silver Gilt Award, awarded by the RHS Village in Bloom judges. Mrs Lucas and Mrs Pickles have worked so hard to ensure the Gardening Club is successful and enjoyable. The children have ensured the garden looks fantastic and they have also learnt a lot. Thank you to Mrs Skipp for her help at Gardening Club.

We are sure you will agree that these awards reflect all of the additional and enriching activities and opportunities that are available at our school. We are extremely grateful to the adults and children who put the extra work in to make them happen.

Dogs

We have had an increase in the amount of dogs that are tied up at the school gates at the start and end of the school day. We kindly ask that dogs are not left tied up or unattended. This will avoid any incidents in the future and ensure all children feel safe coming to and leaving the school site. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.

First Aid Forms

We will be no longer sending home first aid forms for minor accidents. Forms will be sent home for serious accidents such as a bump to the head, eye injuries, possible fracture, deeper cuts etc. On these occasions parents/carers are also contacted by school to inform them. We will encourage the older children to inform you of any minor accidents and the KS1 staff will communicate with parents/carers when necessary.

Fun Run

We will be holding our annual Fun Run on Friday 27th September. This year David Proudfoot of Specsavers has generously donated two Hull City tickets for a game to be held in October. This year we are changing the way the children can win the tickets. Any child who collects sponsorship will be in with the chance of winning the tickets, not the child that raises the most sponsorship money. All names will be put in a hat and drawn at random. All sponsorship money raised will go towards resources that enhance the outdoor environment of school. On the day of the Fun Run the children can bring their change of clothes, in a named bag, to change into after lunch. This could be fancy dress, sports kits or whatever the children prefer. We are looking forward to the children enjoying themselves whilst exercising!

Uniform

At the start of a new school year we feel it is an ideal time to remind parents/carers and children themselves of our uniform policy. The uniform is an important part of our school identity and helps children to feel a sense of belonging.

Our Uniform:

- * Royal blue embroidered sweatshirt or cardigan
- * White or yellow polo/cotton shirt
- * Grey, black or navy skirt, shorts, pinafore dress or trousers (not ski pants, joggers, jeans or leggings)
- * Black shoes
- * Grey, black, navy or white socks/tights
- * Blue/yellow checked summer dress

Indoor PE Kit

- * Royal blue, navy or black shorts
- * Yellow printed T shirt
- * PE Bag—drawstring

Outdoor PE Kit

- * Warm sweatshirt/sweater
- * Trousers, jogging pants or track-suit bottoms
- * Trainers

Please ensure all items are clearly named.

Jewellery, other than a wrist watch, must not be worn to school. We would prefer young children not to have their ears pierced, but if this is the case, they must wear only plain stud earrings which must be removed (where possible) or taped over for PE lessons.

We would prefer the children to have a suitable, age appropriate hairstyle rather than extreme hairstyles such as hair colouring, shaved lines, stars, tramlines, shaven heads, Mohican or any other style that could be a distraction from learning.



Pirate Day

We will be holding our very first whole school Pirate Day on Thursday 19th September. One of the main aims of the day is to inspire our children's writing. All classes will complete written tasks that will use pirates as the main theme. The children will take part in other activities such as making a pirate hat, designing ships/rafts to hold treasure and creating whole school collages for pirates and parrots. The children will not need to dress up on the day as there will be plenty of learning opportunities and activities to immerse themselves in which will ensure a different, enjoyable and enriching learning experience.

First Savers Bank

We operate a First Savers Bank in school every Tuesday and one of our school governors, Mrs Audrey Bjorndal, gives up her time to make this happen. It is open in the Year 6 classroom through the Computing Suite from 8.30-9am and is a great way to encourage children to save and learn about money.

Children can pay in as much or as little as they like and certificates are given when a child reaches certain milestones in their savings. Any child opening a new account is given a free 'piggy' money box to help them save, and throughout the year there are competitions where prizes can be won.
