Learning Letters and Knowledge Organisers

Our Class Curriculum Newsletters will be sent home next week. The information in these letters is a great way for you to see what your child will be learning this term so you can support them on their learning journey.

There are many exciting HCCPS Learning Challenges selected for the Spring term that the children will have the opportunity to develop and further their knowledge and skills in. If you feel you could contribute to the Learning Challenge or know of anyone with specific skills or knowledge in particular areas then please get in touch and let us know.

In addition to our Class Curriculum Newsletter the children will also be given a Knowledge Organiser for their Learning Challenge that will be stuck in Homework books for KS2 and Reading Records for KS1. The Knowledge Organiser has vocabulary, facts, key people and information from the Learning Challenge that your children will be learning about. They will help to ensure children remember as much as they can about their Learning Challenge. At home, you could talk through all of the information and replicate the things we will be doing at school, such as covering up some of the key vocabulary and asking them to identify the word from the definition; or remembering the definition if you give the word. You could ask them to write a sentence about a key figure, or draw a picture/diagram with key information in it. You can use them as you wish, the ideas above are just suggestions. We want children to have a good general knowledge of a range of subjects by the end of their primary school life.

Snow: Important Information

In extreme cases of snow and/or ice, there may be no option but to close the school if there is a severe health and safety risk. A severe health and safety risk would be presented if insufficient staff could reach the school or indeed the health and safety of staff meant that they should leave early. In the event of severe weather, a decision to close the school for pupils will be made by 7.30am. The Headteacher will contact Radio Humberside and Viking Radio to ask them to broadcast the information. Updates will be posted on Twitter and in the notices/news section of the school APP.

Playground areas are gritted if practical before 8:30am and when not, by morning break. All safe routes around the site and across the playground have been identified and will be gritted before giving access to the site. At playtimes a decision as to whether children are allowed outside will be made by the senior teacher on duty in conjunction with a member of the Senior Leadership Team. If the field is covered by thick snow pupils may be allowed to play on the field, make a snowman and throw snowballs. Those not wishing to throw snowballs will be asked to stay on the playground. The school believes that playing in snow is part of a child's life experiences, and as we have had so little in recent years, should be enjoyed! Closing a school at short notice, including closing mid-way through a day, or deciding on a late opening poses considerable difficulties for parents and will only be taken as a very last resort. A complete heating failure in the winter and/or a loss of the water supply would however result in the school having to close. Good communication is essential.

Parents/Carers are asked to be responsible and plan more time for their journey, ensure children have suitable footwear for having to walk further and are wrapped up well to keep warm. Parents should not expect to be able to park close to the school at these times. Parents and visitors are expected to use the gritted paths rather than walk across the snow and ice. We thank you in advance for your cooperation, should we be faced with any severe weather this year.

Attendance

As you are aware, attendance at school has been something that has tightened each year, with restricted holidays and fines imposed. This year, as in previous years any child who has an attendance record of 90% or below will be classed as a persistent absentee. This means that parents/carers will be invited in to school to put an attendance action plan in place and if any of the objectives fail to be met then the Educational Welfare Officer could become involved and this leads to a further action plan. We are here to help and prevent anyone from having to go through that process. We monitor attendance in school and send a letter out to any parents/carers of any child who has an attendance record of 93% or less. Please do not worry about this letter, it is only to highlight your child's attendance and hopefully allow them to avoid reaching the 90% mark.

As in any maintained school in the East Riding, the Headteacher will only authorise absence in line with the East Riding Behaviour and Attendance Partnership 'Absence from School for Exceptional Circumstances Policy'. Headteachers cannot authorise school absence purely for the reason of a family holiday. If your child accrues 10 sessions of unauthorised absence (one days absence equals two sessions) you may be liable for a penalty notice from the Local Council. If your request for authorised absence is declined, and you still take your child out of school a penalty notice could be issued by the Local Council. The school does not receive the money from any fines.

Parish Council Flag Competition

Before the summer holiday all of our children took part in a competition organised by the Parish Council, to design a Village Flag. We had some fantastic entries and the children worked hard to produce some amazing designs. Mr Richardson (Chair of the Parish Council) and Mr Teare came to present the prizes in assembly this week for our winners and runners-up. These children then had the opportunity to go outside and see the flag flying. Well done to all of the children who took part and especially to the winners. We would like to thank the Parish Council for arranging the competition and involving us.



Writing Information/Workshops for Parents

We have decided to run KS1 (Year Reception – Year 2) and KS2 (Year 3 – Year 6) Writing Information sessions which will be full of ideas and ways you can support your child with their writing. We feel that writing is often an area of the curriculum that many children are less confident in. In school we develop and find ways to engage children further and give them the tools and confidence they need to be successful with their writing. These workshops would be a great opportunity to share with you how we teach writing in school so that the children will then have the support they need at home and at school.

We will be running two sessions for each workshop. The KS1 Writing Workshop will be held on Monday 3rd February at 6.00pm and Tuesday 4th February at 2.30pm. The KS2 Writing Workshop will be held on Monday 3rd February at 2.30pm and 6.30pm. The workshops will be led by our KS1 and KS2 teams and will last for approximately 30 minutes.
