The NSPCC's *Speak out, Stay safe,* programme is visiting our school to make sure our pupils have the knowledge and understanding they need to stay safe. With the help of their friendly mascot Buddy, they'll be presenting an assembly to the children in our school as well as a workshop for Year 5 and 6 children.

Coronavirus

We are following all the guidance provided to us by central Government and Public Health England, but we wanted to make you aware of what we are doing in school.

- All children have been taught the 20 second hand wash rule in classes.
- Catch it, bin it, kill it these measures have also been discussed and taught.
- As normal practice, children are washing their hands with soap and water before lunch/fruit time. We are monitoring this more closely at this current time and ensuring they follow the 20 second rule.
- We are also encouraging the children to wash their hands more regularly throughout the day.
- Any visitors to school have been asked if they have visited the countries in Category 1 or 2 since February 2020 and if they have any symptoms, before they are permitted entry.
- Door handles and surfaces are disinfected at least daily to avoid spreading germs.
- From now, we are also adopting the no hand shaking policy.

We would advise that you all take a look at the government guidance in relation to the Coronavirus. This provides all the advice you need, including how and when you would need to take proportionate action. We will continue to keep you updated as we find out any more.
