Car Parking / Dogs

Unfortunately, there are still a lot of cars parking at the front of school at the beginning and end of the school day. Moving in and out of the car park area, at busy times of the day, makes crossing the road to The Green unsafe. We kindly ask those people who travel by car, to park away from school and walk from their cars. This will avoid unnecessary parking and ensure all children are a lot safer during these busy periods. Parking is very limited at the front of school, and for this reason we ask that people avoid parking at the front of school, so that staff, many of whom live outside the village and have to travel to school by car, can park close to the school. We also ask that parents/carers do not bring dogs into the school grounds or leave dogs tied up or unattended at the school gates. This will avoid any incidents in the future and ensure all children feel safe coming to, and leaving, the school site. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Social Media

In our last Newsletter we highlighted to parents/carers that we had been informed that some of the children in school were accessing Social Media sites that were illegal to use until the age of 13. These services include Facebook, Snapchat, Twitter, Instagram, Musical.ly, TikTok, WhatsApp and Skype. We have now also become aware that several children in school are claiming they are in communication with people they do not know online, whether that be via online chat or gaming. We wanted to bring this to your attention to ensure we are all being vigilant and mindful of what the children are doing whilst they are online, especially as the Easter holiday approaches.

Symptoms/Actions

On return to school after the Easter break please remember to follow the procedures below:

Please do not send your child to school if they have any of the Covid-19 symptoms:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss of, or change to, their sense of smell or taste

Organise a test immediately if your child has any of the symptoms listed above.

If a positive test is received your child must self-isolate for at least 10 days and their household for 10 days.

If there is a confirmed positive case at school then Government guidelines will be followed. The rest of the class/bubble will be sent home and asked to self-isolate for 10 days in line with Public Health guidance. Households of the children sent home from the bubble do not need to self-isolate unless the person from the 'class bubble' with whom they live develops symptoms. Should a class group be closed down, the school will immediately switch to providing home learning for that year group during the isolation period.

Take Notice Tuesday

A main focus for our school continues to be on 'The 5 Ways to Wellbeing' – **connect, take notice, keep learning, be active and give**. We will return to school after the Easter break on Tuesday 13th April 2021, and the half term will commence with 'Take Notice Tuesday'. Our wellbeing days will focus on the children completing wellbeing and relaxation activities.

It has been a very different Spring term this year, however we have certainly made the most of the whole school being back together for the final three weeks.
