Miss Ellie Delves will also be leaving to begin her Teacher Training course. We are delighted that she will be returning in January to complete her main teaching placement at our school. Thank you to Miss Delves for all her hard work over the past year working in Year Reception.

We would like to welcome and share with you our new appointments for September. We have appointed three Teaching Assistants, Mrs Clare Young (currently one of our Midday Assistants), Mrs Caroline Harrison and Mrs Lizzy Webster. We are confident that they will bring new skills and experiences to our school and will strengthen our team even further.

We have restructured our Senior Leadership Team for the start of September. Miss Adele Elliott has been internally appointed as our Key Stage 2 Team Leader. We are delighted that Miss Elliott will form part of our Senior Leadership Team. We are confident that she will enhance and support our team to continue to move our school forward to become the best school possible.

Mrs Hayhurst, Mrs Pickles, Mrs Walker and Mrs Lilly also cover teacher's Planning, Preparation and Assessment Time and Subject/Senior Leadership Time, therefore they will be teaching in various classes at points throughout the week.

## Transition / Move Up Mornings

The children will have the opportunity to spend two mornings with their new class teacher and teaching assistants. Due to bubbles the children will remain in their current classrooms and areas in school and the adults will come to them. Although the children will not experience spending time in their new classroom they will greatly benefit from meeting the adults they will be working with. The mornings provide an opportunity to set the expectations for the next school year and excite the children with new learning challenges and topics which they will be learning all about. Staff also focus on 'getting to know you' sessions which enables the staff to learn more about the children and to start building relationships. This also supports the children with any concerns or anxieties they may have about the changes they will face on their return to school after the summer break. Staff also hold a transition meeting where they pass on information regarding each child to their next teacher. Information consists of academic, social, emotional and anything else they feel needs to be shared with the next teacher. This enables a smooth transition and means staff can hit the ground running in September.

## Basic Skills Quality Mark

Mrs Hoyle and Mrs Leeks have successfully secured the Basic Skills Quality Mark for EYFS and the whole school for a further three years. Following a rigorous assessment process, they were able to evidence and explain how our school meets the requirements to achieve the Quality Mark. The Basic Skills Quality Mark is nationally recognised accreditation against ten key elements of school improvement. This is an award that celebrates and supports continuous improvement in literacy and numeracy and is awarded to schools in recognition of their provision, practice and performance in these areas. To attain the award Hutton Cranswick C P School demonstrated a whole school approach to improving standards in literacy and numeracy, with evidence of the impact of its approaches. Thank you to all the staff at our school for continuing to raise standards in these areas and particular thanks to Mrs Hoyle and Mrs Leeks, for their hard work during the assessment process.
