Reading Books



Daily reading continues to be of importance, especially reading to an adult at home and spending time discussing the text they have read. Within class guided reading sessions, we will be completing past reading papers, becoming more familiar with the types of questions we will be asked and the answers that are required.

Maths

Maths this term will be primarily focusing on developing reasoning and problem solving skills in preparation for the statutory assessments in May. There will be a large focus on multi-step problem solving where your child will be required to apply their mathematical knowledge in a range of different ways. We will also be completing weekly arithmetic tests to maximise their confidence and ensure they are familiar with the layout.

Times tables continue to be extremely important in many aspects of our maths curriculum. While we carry on teaching these skills, please spend as much time as possible helping your child to be as confident as they can in this area.

Safety and PSHCE/HeartSmart

Safer Internet Day 2022 will be celebrated on the 8th February with the theme 'All fun and games? Exploring respect and relationships online'. The purpose of the day is to promote the positive use of digital technology for children, and to generate conversation about using technology responsibly, respectfully, critically and creatively.

Our HeartSmart theme for the beginning of this half term is 'Too Much Selfie Isn't Healthy'. Within this theme, children will continue to built their character, emotional health and resilience. Children will be encouraged to adopt a growth mindset whilst maintaining a healthy emotional epicentre. All of these qualities are essential for Year 6 children when it comes to facing their statutory assessments in May and their transition to secondary school. We will also continue to explore and promote British Values and life in Modern Britain.

Learning Challenge

Our Learning Challenge for the Spring term is: "Why is the rainforest important to us all?" We will start by completing a KWL Grid, which for each child shows (what I know/what I want to learn/what I have learnt). We will return to the KWL Grid at the end of the topic and complete the third column (what I have learnt) to show clearly what the children have learnt during the topic.

As part of our geography Learning Challenge, we will locate rainforests and learn about their layers. We will be focusing on the Amazon Rainforest and looking at the climate, plants, animals and people as well as the adaptations that are required to live there.

In Science, our topic will be 'Animals including humans'. In this topic, we will identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system and describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood. The children will be able to recognise the impact of diet, exercise and lifestyle on the way their bodies function.

A large part of Year 6 is preparing the children ready for their transition to secondary school. As part of this, there will be an increase in homework this year. Children will be given a spellings list to learn, a piece of GPS work or a maths task, along with the expectation of them learning/improving the speed of their recall of all times tables. Homework will be given out on a Friday and needs to be **returned by the following Wednesday** in order to allow time for us to mark and give feedback on this work. Most of the work will need to be completed within their own CGP books. It is essential that these books are brought to and from school. There will be no replacements available. Every child is expected to complete all pieces of work they are set.

Art/DT

Our Art and D&T sessions will link with our Learning Challenges this term. We will be developing our art skills using a range of media and techniques. The children will be creating their own rainforest painting in the style of Henri Rousseau.



In D&T, children will design, make and evaluate their own Fairtrade snack. This will be completed during Fairtrade Fortnight from Monday 28th February.

Story Time

We always read a class story, and other short stories, throughout the year. This term we will be reading the novel 'The Explorer' by Katherine Rundell - a brilliant adventure story linked with our Rainforest topic!
