Year 5 Forest Schools

Year 5 have completed their five weekly Forest Schools sessions led by Mary Smith. Their sessions have been linked to their Learning Challenge – The Vikings. They have thoroughly enjoyed the inspiring sessions and really looked forward to Tuesday afternoons.

The children have made Viking weapons (bows and arrows, spears, swords) by wood carving and made dens using knot tying skills. They also enjoyed making their own mini fires, using a flint and steel to light them, which took a lot of resilience and perseverance. In addition to this they cooked Viking stew on an open fire and also cooked cakes in a banana skin or within orange peel. Climbing trees and playing games have also been a highlight of their sessions.
